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MUNICIPAL GENERAL INFORMATION

Laikipia County borders Samburu County to the North, Isiolo County to the North East, Meru County to the East, Nyeri County to the South East, Nyandarua County to the South, Nakuru County to the South West and Baringo County to the West. The County lies between latitudes 0° 18" South and 0° 51" North and between longitude 36° 11" and 37° 24' East. It covers an area of 9,462 km² and ranks as the 15th largest county in the country by land size. Map 1 shows the geographical position of Laikipia County in Kenya. The gazetted county headquarter is Rumuruti Town but has been hosted at Nanyuki Town since inception of devolution in 2013.

The expansion of urban areas in the County including in Rumuruti has been rapid and unplanned. There is therefore a pressing need to control development and promote sustainable development in Rumuruti Municipality, being the gazette County capital through a municipality plan within the proposed boundary.

ADMINISTRATIVE UNITS

The administrative unit of RUMURUTI Municipality is the managerial and decision-making structures of the municipality that are used in handling socio-economic development issues affecting the people of the municipality.

ROAD AND AIR TRANSPORT

Rumuruti municipality has one very significant class b road, the Rumuruti- Maralal highway that connects to the neighboring county, Samburu.

Rumuruti municipality has capacity for development of an airstrip owing to the expansive land area allocated for air infrastructure.

- Lack of infrastructure like trailer parks, bus parks, bypass roads, street lights, car parks, taxi parks, built up markets, bus stages, boda boda parks, etc.
