Normalcy Returning Ol Moran, Sosian Schools



The Government continues to support local institutions to resume their normal operations. Here the government delivered water to Survey secondary school on Thursday. More than half of the students are back in class

Situation in most schools in Ol Moran and Sosian is fast coming back to normal.

A survey carried out by government on schools within the zone on Wednesday showed that schools in Ol Moran and Sosian had more pupils, students and teachers present.

Only two out of the 24 primary schools were still shut.

The 24 primary schools with a total number of 3,809 pupils had a combined attendance of 2,445 pupils on Wednesday.

In the five secondary schools within the zone the combined enrolment is 1,340. Out of this number 778 were already in school on Wednesday when the survey was done.

In the primary schools, 115 out of 136 teachers were present. In the secondary 41 out all 42 teachers were present.
