1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Introduction

The PFM Act 2012, section 125 stipulates the county budgeting process which involves several steps and stages in every financial year. The county budgeting process in any given financial year involves; formulation of Annual Development Plan; Preparation of County Budget Review and Outlook Paper; Compilation of Sector Working Group Reports; Formulation and adoption of County Fiscal Strategy Paper; preparation of budget estimates for the county government and submission of estimates to the county assembly; approving of the estimates by the county assembly; enactment of an appropriation law and any other laws required to implement the county government's budget; implementation of the county government's budget; and accounting for, and evaluating, the county government's budgeted revenues and expenditures.

The PFM Act 2012, through section 125 (2) further requires the County Executive Committee Member for finance to ensure there is public participation in the county budgeting process. Public participation provides an all-inclusive avenue where key stakeholders and the general public can identify and prioritize government projects and activities under the budgeting process. This process commenced early in the budget preparation process with the preparation of ADP 2025/2026 where views were sought from the public on the priority issues affecting them and proposed interventions. Additionally, public engagements were also conducted during the formulation of CFSP 2025 and DMSP 2025 to gather broad priority issues to inform determination of sector ceilings for the 2025/2026 financial year.

In line with constitutional and legal provisions on transparency, accountability, and inclusivity in governance, the County Government of Laikipia organized public participation forums on the proposed budget estimates for the upcoming financial year 2025/2026. The objective was to collect input from citizens across the county wards to ensure the budget reflects local needs and priorities.

The public participation forums for the 2025/2026 County Budget Estimates were held across 15 venues at ward level, where the participants were given draft copies of the estimates in order for them to provide their inputs and recommendations for consideration before the Budget Estimates are finalized. This report therefore provides a summary of the views, inputs and recommendations gathered during the just concluded public participation forums for consideration by the county departments and the County Assembly.

1.2 Legal Basis of Public Participation

The Constitution of Kenya 2010, Public Finance Management Act 2012, County Government Act 2012, and the Laikipia County Public Participation Act, 2014 outlines the need and requirement for public participation across the planning and budgeting processes in the county.

The Constitution of Kenya 2010, article 201 stipulates the need for public participation in all financial matters. The County Government Act 2012 Section 105 and 106 provides for citizen engagement and participation in county planning.

The Public Finance Management Act, 2012 and the PFM Act 2012 (County Government) Regulations 2015 requires the County Treasuries to organize for effective public participation in budget process. In particular, PFM Act 2012 and County Government Regulations 2015 section 7 specifies the process and procedures of public participation in planning and budgeting.

1.3 Procedures for Public Participation

PFM Act 2012 (County Government) Regulations 2015, section 7 states that;

- 1) For purposes of public participation in the planning and budgeting process, there shall be participatory structures and processes that shall encompass a broad range of strategies including:
 - Open forums, written submissions, online platform and media.
 - Specifications of venues of public participation.
 - Dates of public participation.
- 2) The CEC member shall notify the general public through a notice in the gazette or at least two newspapers of countywide circulation on the venue and manner of submitting written submissions.
- 3) The documents submitted to the county assembly and any other published documents shall be published and publicized within 7 days of presentation.
- 4) The CECM shall give a responsibility statement confirming the extent to which the general public was consulted.

1.4 Objectives of the Public Participation Exercise

The public participation forums at ward level were guided by the following objectives namely;

- To inform the public about the proposed budget estimates.
- To gather feedback and recommendations from citizens.
- To ensure the budget is inclusive and addresses the priorities of diverse communities.
- To foster transparency and public trust in the budgeting process.
- To give feedback to the public on the progress made in implementation of development projects in 2023/24 FY.

1.5 Methodology

Towards realizing the set objectives, 15 ward level public forums were planned to deliberate on the proposed county budget estimates for the 2025/2026 financial year during the third week of April 2025. The forums organized by the County Department of Finance and Economic Planning were held across the 15 venues within the county wards on 16th and 17th April, 2025.

The following framework guided the public participation forums;

- i. Approval by the County Treasury
- ii. Advertisement of the exercise in the Newspaper, Radio stations, county website and public places.
- iii. Mobilisation of participants at the ward levels.
- iv. Training of Facilitators for the exercise.
- v. Holding of the Actual public participation meetings at ward level.
- vi. Documentation of the views and inputs at ward level.
- vii. Preparation and consolidation of County final Public Participation report on 2025/2026 Budget Estimates.

During the meetings, the following procedure was applied;

- Presentation on the County budget process
- Presentation on the progress made in implementation of 2023/2024 county development projects.
- Presentation on the proposed 2025/2026 County Budget Estimates across the departments.
- Contributions by the participants giving inputs, views and recommendations on their priority areas for intervention during the 2025/2026 financial year.
- Documentation and capturing of the participants' views and inputs as guided in the reporting template.

This report contains the public contributions on proposed priority projects for considerations in the fiscal year 2025/26 budget estimates and the medium term.

2.2 General Observations and recommendations:

- Appreciation by members of the public on their continued engagements by county government on matters development.
- Clarification of the Nyahururu municipality boundaries i.e. Town, Maina, Manguo, Site and Co-site areas during the public participation.
- The public requested the presence of senior officers such as Chief officers in future engagements.
- There is need to indicate the actual completion percentage of projects especially road construction and reasons for those that have stalled in the feedback for previous budget periods.
- Have signage /posters at the beginning of project implementation was also stressed.
- There is need for a public participation mechanism that facilitates the representation of each and every location within the wards to eliminate budget imbalances.
- Supply of additional radiology machines such as X-rays, CT scanners, MRI machines and ultrasound machines as well as additional experienced imaging staff to Nyahururu County Referral Hospital.
- Municipality funds be devolved directly to the boards to ensure timely and efficient service delivery.
- Prioritization of local contractors—especially the youth—in line with equitable economic empowerment.
- There were concerns that some areas within the wards had been consistently overlooked in county development initiatives.
- Enhance security in Sosian ward, in which the local administrators were working with the police and Kenya army to bring peace to the area.
- There was representation of CSOs including GROOTs Kenya, Heinnet and Pathways during the public participation forums in some of the wards.
- Need for involvement of more technical officers at ward levels during public participation forums.
- Fast tracking the completion of stalled and ongoing projects.
- Involvement of the community in projects implementation to ensure ownership and sustainability.
- Establishment of feedback mechanisms especially on implementation progress of the previous year budget.
- Enhance mobilization of participants through local radio stations, public notices and through other channels of communication.
- Strengthen the public participation unit for overall coordination of public participation and civic education.

This includes all allocations in the other County Departments that lie within the precincts of the 3 Municipalities.
