# County Builds a Tuberculosis (TB) Isolation Ward at Nyahururu GK Prison

The Laikipia County Department of Health and Public Services has established a Tuberculosis (TB) isolation block within Nuahururu GK Prison to help reduce overcrowding at the Nyahururu County Referral Hospital (NCRH) - General.

The facility was officially inaugurated on October 9. 2024, by Governor Joshua Irungu EGH, with Principal Secretary of Correctional Services. Salome Wairimu Muhia, also in attendance.

In a setting like this prison, where a large number of individuals are confined within a limited space, the risk of TB transmission—a highly contagious diseasebecomes significant, posing a major health risk to both inmates and prison staff.

This concern prompted the construction of the isolation ward at the Nuahururu correctional facility, as part of the county's mandate to provide health services to public institutions and oversee health service delivery in the area.

According to Mr. David Muriithi who serves as the County TB and Leprosy Coordinator (CTLC), the new facility will be instrumental





in the fight against TB within the prison. He noted that prisons often face challenges like delayed diagnosis, inadequate treatment, overcrowding, poor ventilation, and frequent inmate transfersall factors that accelerate TB transmission, making control and prevention

efforts more challenging.

The isolation ward will support the three government-operated dispensaries located within the correctional facilities in Rumuruti, Nanyuki, and Nyahururu.

# Empowering Self-Help Groups: 21 Groups Receive Ksh 4.1 million Loan from County Enterprise Fund

Twenty-one (21) Self-Help Groups from Nanyuki and Thingithu Wards have received a total loan amounting to Ksh. 4.1 million from the Laikipia County Enterprise Fund.

Seven groups from Thingithu Ward received Ksh. 1.35 million, while fourteen groups from Nanyuki Ward received Ksh. 2.75 million. All groups will repay the loan at an interest rate of six percent, which is half of what is typically offered by commercial banks and Saccos.

The fund was awarded to the successful groups that had applied, with the smallest loan being Ksh. 50,000 and the largest Ksh. 300,000.

While presiding over the cheque issuance, H.E. Governor Joshua Irungu, EGH, commended the self-help groups for their industriousness and entrepreneurial spirit. He challenged them to invest the resources wisely to achieve their business goals.

"If you use these funds well, uour businesses will not only grow, but you will also improve your economic well-being and create employment for the people





of Laikipia," Governor Irungu advised.

Deputy Governor H.E. Reuben Kamuri encouraged the groups to inspire other village-based groups, including women's, youth, and men's groups, to consider the loan facilitu. He emphasized that there are never enough resources for expansion, and that responsible borrowing and prudent use of resources is the only way groups and individuals can grow their enterprises.

Groups can access funding through group loans, LPOs/ LSOs financina, agribusiness financing, and 80 percent asset financing, all at six percent per annum with up to a 24-month repayment period.

enhance infrastructure," he stated.



# Governor Irungu Presides Over Land Ownership Vetting Meeting in Rumuruti

On October 2, 2024. Laikipia Governor H.E. Joshua Irungu led an open public engagement with stakeholders from the African Location, Kandutura, and Milimani villages in Rumuruti Municipality to review and verify land ownership claims. This step aims to facilitate the processing of secure legal ownership documents.

The meeting, attended by the National Land Commission (NLC) County Coordinator. relevant county executives, representatives from the Rumuruti business community, and village leaders. marked the start of a thorough verification process.

This initiative will vet and confirm legitimate claims, address any irregular or fraudulent claims, and ensure compliance with legal requirements before issuing secure ownership documents.

Currently, over 800 subdivided plots are prepared for allocation. To manage this process effectively, Mashinani Development Committees have been established across all areas to ensure fairness in the distribution of plots.



Each beneficiary will be allocated one plot, with detailed record checks to prevent double allocations and promote transparency. Once finalized, the allocation lists will be digitized in collaboration with the NLC to enhance security and ensure transparent recordkeeping.

This initiative is recognized as a significant step in addressing historical land injustices and providing Rumuruti residents with long-awaited security of tenure. Additionallu, plans are in progress to improve local infrastructure, including road development and establishing the Rumuruti Water and Sewerage Company. These efforts aim to address water

scarcity and generate employment for local youth.

"I would like to thank the Governor and the Department of Lands for fulfilling their promise by elevating Rumuruti to municipality status and providing us with a pathway to land ownership. Many of us have lacked security of tenure for decades, and this initiative gives us hope for a better future," shared Agnes Alimlinga, a resident of Kandutura

Governor Irungu was ioined bu CS Mr. Koinange Wahome, CECM Lands Mr. Ekwam Nabos. CO Lands Mr. John Gichuki, NLC Laikipia County Coordinator Grace Wairagu, and other county officials.

# Rumuruti Oxygen Plant Delivered: Towards a Level Four Health Facility

The County Department of Health is making significant strides in upgrading Rumuruti Sub-County Hospital to a Level Four facility by developing essential infrastructure and procuring modern equipment.

On June 21, the hospital took a major step forward with the groundbreaking of the first-ever Pressure Swing Adsorption (PSA) Oxygen Plant at Rumuruti Sub-County Hospital. This plant is designed to reliably supply 200 litres of oxugen per minute, ensuring a steadu supply without strain.

Dr. Arthur Mumelo. the Medical Superintendent of the hospital, along with the management team, was present to receive and inspect the new equipment. The oxygen plant forms part of a larger partnership project funded by KSh 121 million from the Global Fund. which is being implemented by Amref Health Africa in Kenya in collaboration with the Ministry of Health.

Dr. Mumelo commended the collaboration between the County Government of Laikipia, Amref Health Africa, and the Ministry of Health, noting the positive impact this initiative will have on



patients in need of oxygen. He expressed his gratitude to the project team for the swift delivery of the oxygen plant.

This project represents a transformative phase for the hospital, which is expected to include a functioning theatre bu December 2024 and a radiology unit with a modern X-ray service by March 2025.

Also present at the event

were Grace Kahiga, a biomedical engineer from Amref, and Hillaru Kosqei, technical director from DEBRA Limited, which is overseeing the project. Representatives from the LHS Supply Chain Management Office and the hospital's medical engineering team were also in attendance.

## Laikipia Agricultural Sector Set To Benefit From **Enhanced Collaboration With KOICA**

The CEC Agriculture, Mr. Dennis Kasoo, led Laikipia County's agriculture department in a fourday training organized by the Korea International Cooperation Agency (KOICA) through the Capacity Improvement and Advancement for Tomorrow (CIAT) program.

This program provides policymakers, public servants, and experts from developing countries with an opportunity to visit Korea for technical training and knowledge sharing, strengthening international cooperation and development.

The visit was designed to explore South Korea's latest agricultural technologies and facilitate an exchange of best practices between the two countries.

Accompanied by the Chief Officer of Livestock and Fisheries. Maru Gichuru. Mr. Kasoo expressed keen interest in learning from South Korea's advanced agricultural sustems. particularly in poultry, pig farming, dairy farming, and maize production. where South Korea leads in numerous maize varieties and utilizes cutting-edge



mechanization, including drone technologu.

South Korea's innovative agricultural solutions have positioned it as a leader in managing challenges such as limited arable land and mitigagating effects of climate change. These advancements allow Korea to maintain high levels of agricultural productivity despite environmental constraints, making it a model of efficiency and adaptability.

During the visit, the Laikipia delegation toured several agricultural research institutions and model farms. Theu observed firsthand how mechanization is being used to increase productivity, reduce labour costs. and improve the quality of



agricultural outputs, a transformative approach that could greatly benefit the Laikipia agricultural sector.

Mr. Kasoo also noted the critical role of well-organized cooperatives in Korea, which drive productivity and enhance farmers' dedication to their farms. This commitment, combined with cooperative support, has significantly contributed to the high agricultural yields in Korea.

The knowledge gained through this visit is expected to inspire innovation within Laikipia, potentially leading to improved food security and sustainable growth in the county's agricultural sector.

# Homa Bay Economic Planning Team Benchmarks with Laikipia's Directorate of Economic Planning

On October 17, 2024, a team from Homabay County's Directorate of Economic Planning and Budgeting visited the Directorate of Economic Planning and County Development in Laikipia County to benchmark Laikipia's Statistical Abstract.

The visit aimed to gain insights and practical knowledge from Laikipia's approach, as Homabau County prepares to release its first edition of a County Statistical Abstract by the end of 2024.

During the benchmarking, the Homabay team explored the entire process involved in creating a statistical abstract, including the design of data collection tools, data entry, data verification, validation processes, as well as the publication and dissemination of the final document. Each stage is critical for ensuring data accuracy, consistency, and relevance, especially for economic planning and monitoring development progress.

Laikipia County is recognized as a leader in this area, being the first county to produce a statistical abstract consistently each year, with the latest edition published



in 2023.



As part of the visit, the Safaricom Foundation team also distributed "mama kits" to all new mothers in the unit to support their care and that of their newborns.

Deputy Governor Kamuri



expressed appreciation for the Safaricom team, led by Mr. Ndegwa, for considering Laikipia County in their strategic community empowerment plan. He reiterated the government's commitment to seeking and welcoming development partners who can complement the County Integrated Development Plan (CIDP) implementation.
